Here are all of the templates you need to create the fab gifts in this issue

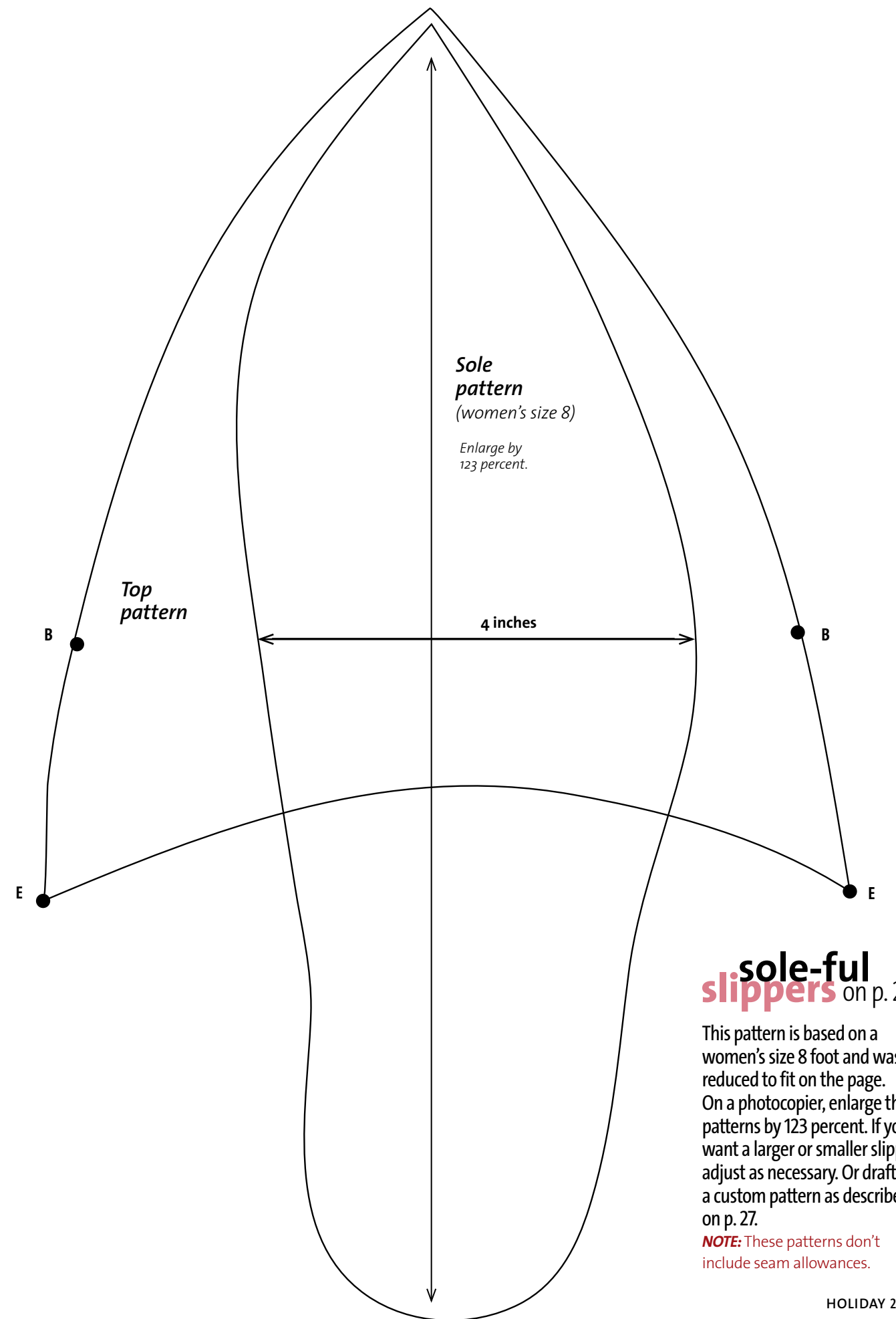


vintage coasters on p. 22

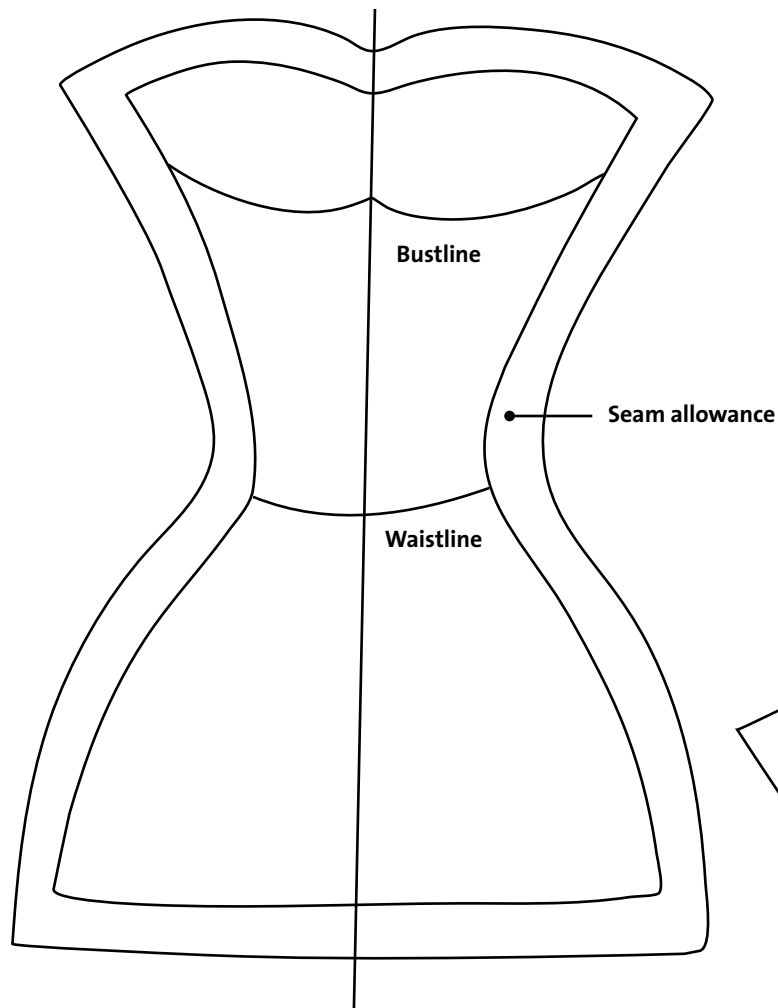


sole-ful slippers on p. 26

NOTE: These patterns don't include seam allowances.

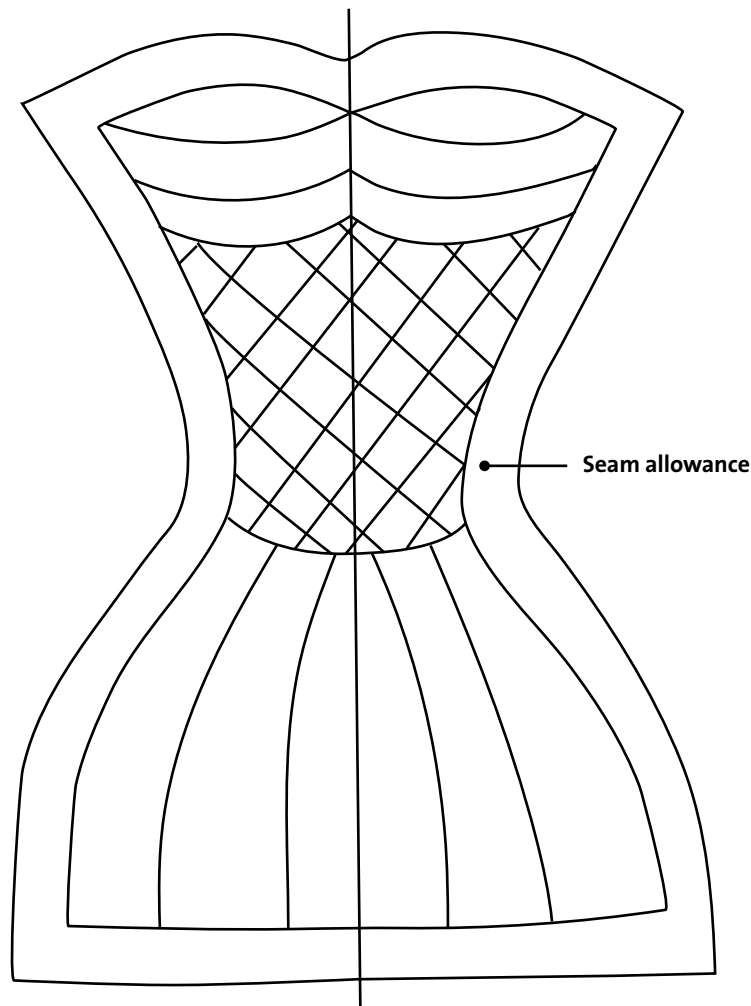
Basic shape

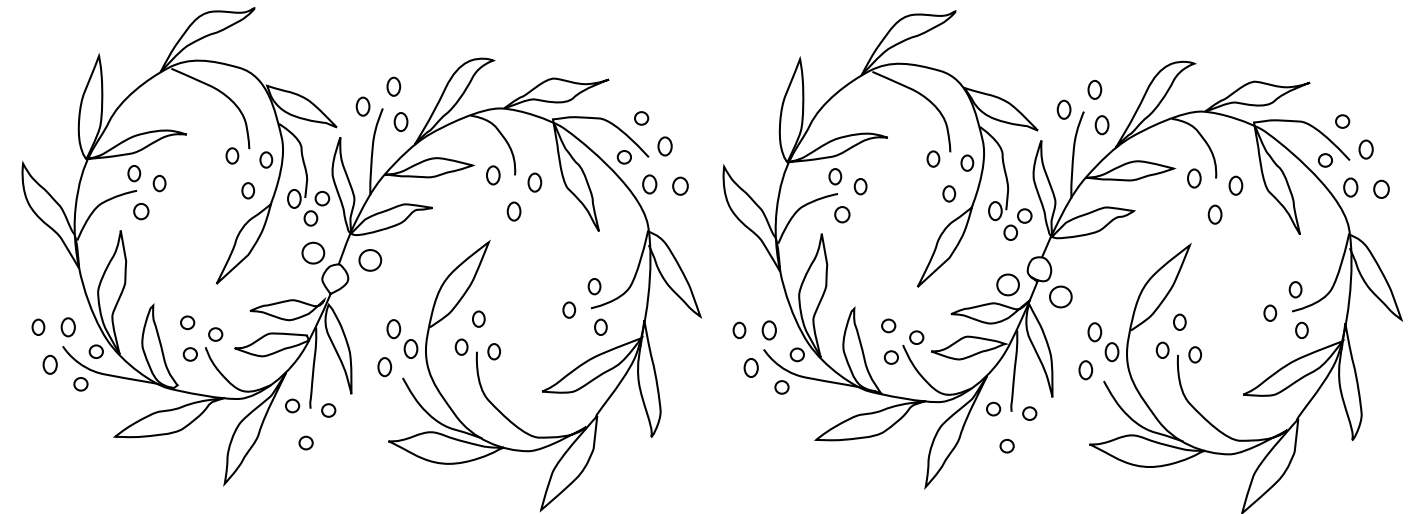
Quilted version



bead like a pro on p. 60

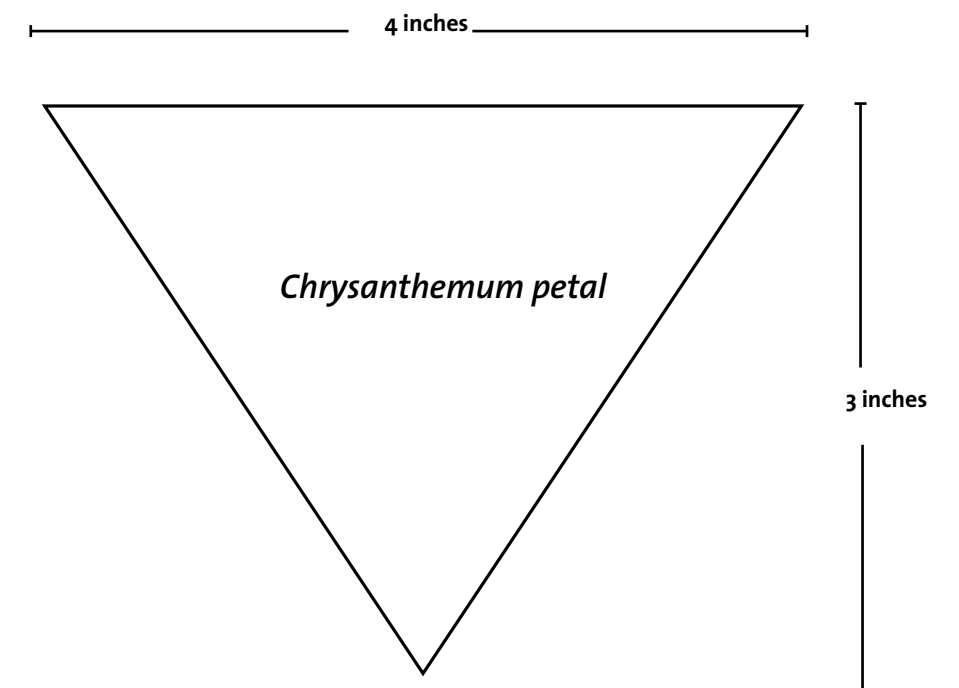
This leaf-and-berry design is presented full size. Feel free to reduce or enlarge it as necessary.

fabric blooms on p. 69

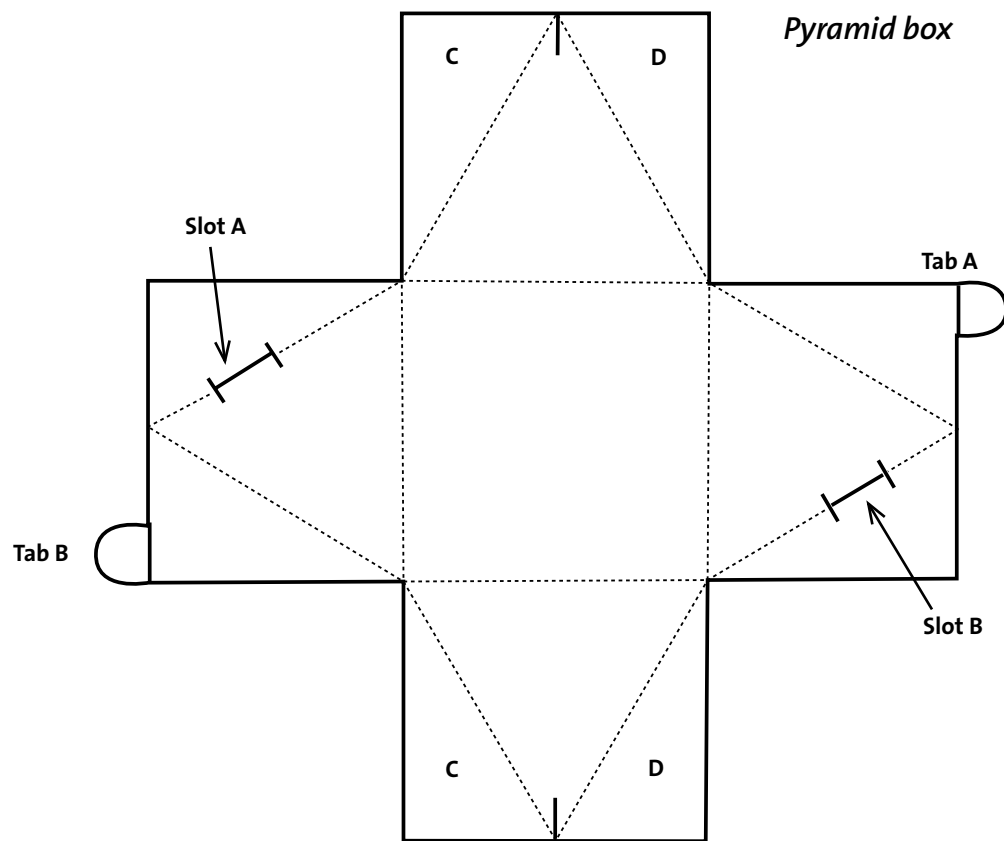
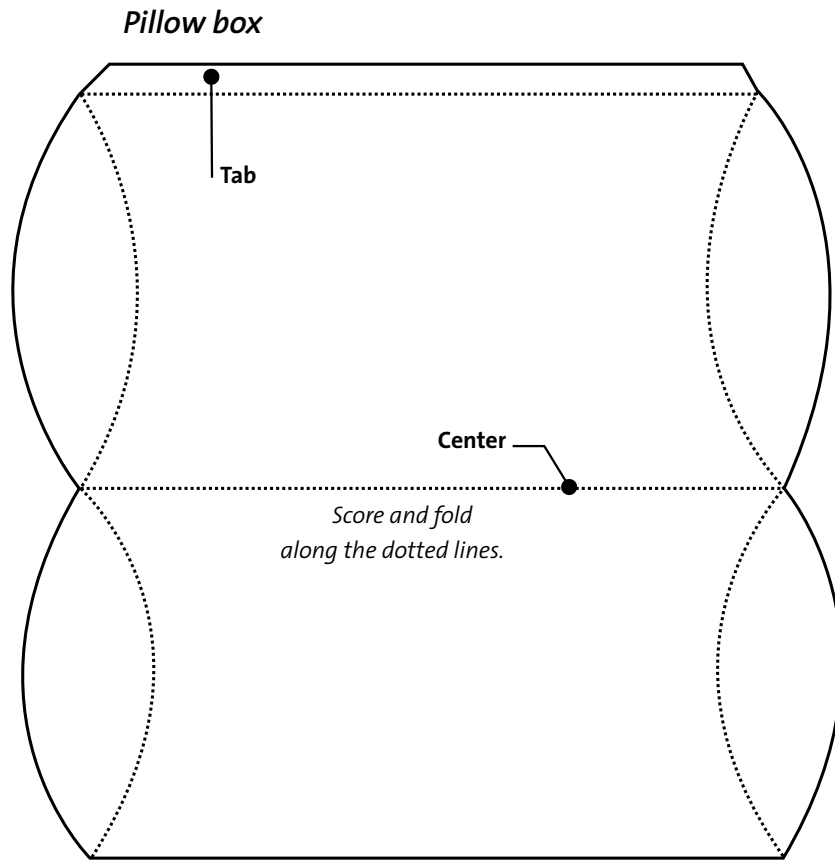
This chrysanthemum petal is presented full size. Feel free to reduce or enlarge it as necessary.

On a photocopier, enlarge the pillow-box pattern at left 200 percent for a 7-inch-long package. Feel free to adjust as desired to make the package size of your choice.

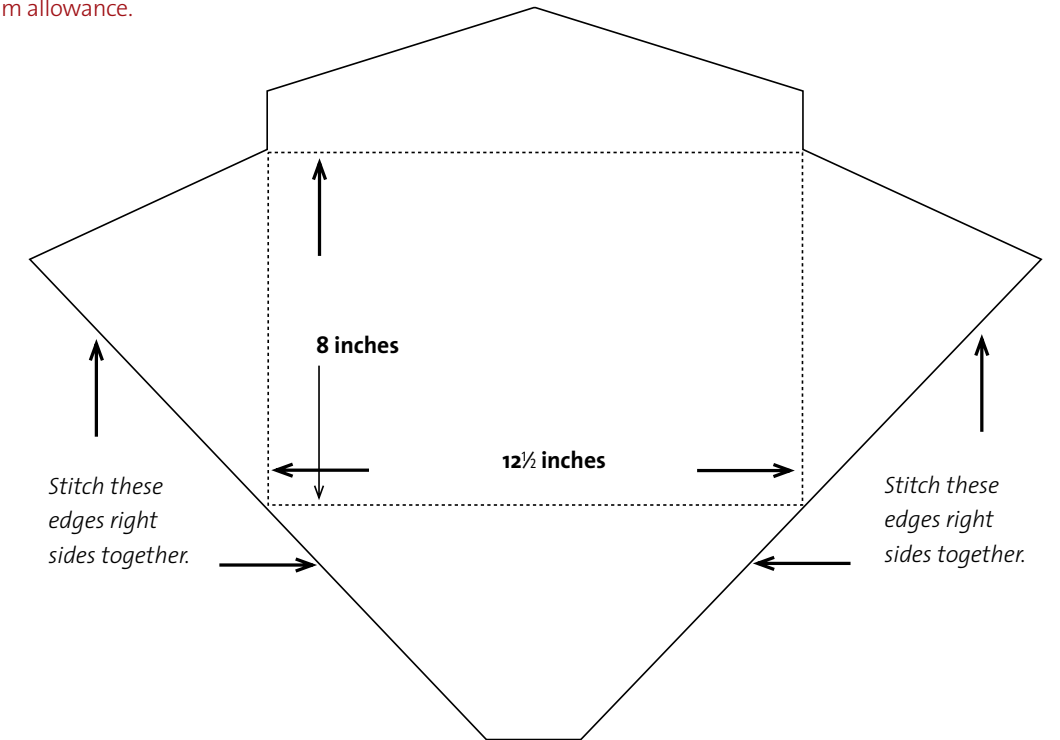
For the pyramid-box pattern below, enlarge the pattern 300 percent on a photocopier to get a base square size of 4½ inches. Or, adjust the percentage as desired.



organza envelopes on p. 76

On a photocopier, enlarge this pattern to 460 percent to produce the dimensions listed below. You can then adjust the envelope size as desired to fit your gift.

NOTE: This pattern doesn't include seam allowance.



textile triangles on p. 78

On a photocopier, enlarge this pattern at 185 percent to produce a 3D triangle with a 6-inch base. You can enlarge or reduce the pattern to create a collection of different-sized triangles, as shown on p. 78.
